

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER**  
**City of Williams PWS AZ0403026**  
**Has Levels of Arsenic Above Drinking Water Standards**

Our water system, City of Williams, recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor of the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received on in the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter show that our system exceeds the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for arsenic. The standard for arsenic is 10 parts per billion (ppb). The average level of arsenic over the last year has been 17 ppb.

**What should I do?**

- There is nothing you need to do. **You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.** However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.
- If you have a severely compromised immune system, have an infant, are pregnant, or are elderly, you may be at increased risk and should seek advice from your health care providers about drinking this water

**What does this mean?**

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been you would have been notified immediately. Some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with circulatory system, and many have an increased risk of getting cancer.

**What is being done?**

We will continue to monitor for Arsenic on a quarterly basis.
