## Has Levels of Arsenic Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system Greenfield Ranchettes recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor of the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received on (give date) show that our system exceeds the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for arsenic. The standard for arsenic is 10 parts per billion (ppb). Arsenic was found at 32 ppb on July 31, and at 6 ppb on August 13.

### What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g. bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

#### What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been you would have been notified immediately. Some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with circulatory system, and many have an increased risk of getting cancer.

### What is being done?

We collected a confirmation sample after being notified of the exceedance. The results of this testing were below the drinking water standard. We are continuing to monitor the situation to ensure the safety of your water supply.
