

## Lead and Copper Sampling and Reporting Requirements

To help set up your system for success, here's what you need to know about lead and copper sampling and reporting requirements:

- **June 1 – September 30** | Systems on annual or triennial monitoring must collect Lead and Copper samples during this period.
- **Sample Plans** | Must be submitted to [PBCU@azdeq.gov](mailto:PBCU@azdeq.gov) by systems that collect Lead and Copper samples.
- **October 10** | Last day to submit sample plans and analytical results.
- **Lead Consumer Notices** | Must be issued to residences/service connections where samples were collected — even if lead was not detected — within 30 days of a system's notification of results.
- **December 31** | Lead Consumer Notices and Certification form must be submitted to [PBCU@azdeq.gov](mailto:PBCU@azdeq.gov) by this date.
