

Getting Ready for Renewal

Nearly 1,500 ADEQ Certified Operators' certificates expire between February 2019 and June 2019. To keep your certificates active:

- Make sure you have plenty of Professional Development Hours (PDHs) and record each day of training
- Download and complete the updated renewal form from ADEQ's Operator Certification page
- Mail the renewal form and payment together
