

**PROPOSED ARIZONA POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (AZPDES)  
RENEWAL PERMIT**

Pursuant to the Clean Water Act and in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) R18-9-A907, the Director of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) proposes to issue an Arizona Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (AZPDES) Permit to discharge pollutants to Waters of the United States to the following applicant, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions:

The Town of Snowflake applied for a renewal AZPDES permit for the proposed discharge of up to 0.6 million gallons per day (mgd) of treated domestic wastewater from the Snowflake Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to Cottonwood Wash in the Little Colorado River Basin in Township 13N, Range 21 E, Section 14, in Mojave County, Arizona. The Snowflake WWTP is a publicly owned treatment works that receives domestic wastewater from residential, and commercial sources in Snowflake. Sludge from the wastewater treatment plant is hauled to Painted Desert Landfill.

All written comments received by ADEQ by the close of business on the date 30 days after publication of this notice will be considered in the final permit decision. A public hearing request must be in writing and must include the reasons for such request. If there is a significant degree of public interest, the Director will hold a hearing in accordance with A.A.C. R18-9-A908(B).
