Your Arizona registration may be renewed up to 90 days prior to expiration. If your vehicle is in an area that requires an emission test for renewal, and your vehicle will be out of state during or after that 90 day period, you may request a testing exemption from ADEQ.

- A. If your vehicle is located **in an area that has an emission inspection program**, you must have the vehicle tested there and submit a passing Vehicle Inspection Report. This is an official document issued by the inspection authority, and must indicate the agency issuing the document.
- B. If your vehicle that requires testing is **NOT in an area of another state that has an emission inspection program**, you must complete the **Vehicle Identification Information, Signature** and have the **Out-Of-State Verification** section of this form completed by a local law enforcement official, Notary (military police/base security when applying for military exemption) or Department of Motor Vehicles official in that state.

<b>Out-Of-State Verification (needed ONLY if a Vehicle Inspection Report is NOT submitted)</b>	
To obtain an exemption from emissions testing, Arizona law requires that the owner have a local law enforcement official or Department of Motor Vehicle official verify that the vehicle described hereon is at the city/state claimed above.

**For Military Service**

1. Application should be completed within 90 days of temporary deployment
2. If you are stationed within the United States or its Territories, "Out of State" exemption should be completed
3. The vehicle must be registered to the applicant
4. This form must be signed by the appropriate personnel
5. Send the completed application, and a copy of the Arizona registration renewal form, along with the \$9.50 processing fee (check, money order, payable to ADEQ) and a self-address stamped envelope if you don't have an email address.

**Non Military**

1. A passing Vehicle Inspection Report (if applicable), OR completed Out-Of-State Application.
2. Processing fee of \$9.50 (check/money order payable to ADEQ, check must show the imprinted name and physical address of the customer – no post office boxes).
3. A copy of the Arizona registration renewal form or vehicle title/ bill of sale, and a self-addressed/stamped envelope. (If you would like certificate sent back to you)
