6. **America's Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA)- (Discussion)**Background: The America's Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA), signed in 2018, amended the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) to improve and streamline communication between community water systems and emergency response agencies.
7. **Highly Hazardous Flammable Trains (HHFT) - (Discussion).** In 2019, PHMSA issued a rule under the FAST Act concerning High-Hazard Flammable Trains (HHFTs). The primary objective of this rule is to ensure that state and local emergency responders are informed of hazardous materials moving through their jurisdictions to facilitate better preparation and response.
