FERP Reference Sheet

Is a FERP Required?

Facilities are required to provide a Facility Emergency Response Plan (FERP) if they are reporting an Extremely Hazardous Substance (EHS) at or above that substance's Threshold Planning Quantity (TPQ) (ARS 49-127 (A)). The list of TPQs for EHSs can be found in <u>Appendices A and B of 40 CFR Part 355</u> and in the <u>EPA's Consolidated List of Lists</u>.

What should be included in a FERP?

Per ARS 49-127(D), the Facility Emergency Response Plan must include:

- Names, addresses, and emergency telephone numbers of facility emergency coordinator and an alternate.
- A description of emergency warning systems and a list of emergency units, emergency personnel, and health professionals in close proximity to the facility.
- Description of employee emergency response training and emergency preparedness programs.
- Description of appropriate emergency equipment necessary to respond to a release.
- Description of emergency response procedures, including notification procedures and evacuation plans in the event of a release.
- If known, identification of transport routes and transportation methods used to transport extremely hazardous substances to and from the facility.
- Provisions for at least an annual review of the plan and provisions to demonstrate the capability to
 execute the plan on the request of the department.
