## Site Map Reference Sheet

## What is a Site Map and is it required?

A site map is a diagram that shows the layout of the facility and indicates the location of the substances reported on a facility's Tier II report. The site map is vital Tier II information for first responders as it allows for better response planning. At the request of fire agencies and Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC), all facilities that are submitting a Tier II report, regardless of whether or not they are reporting extremely hazardous substances above threshold planning quantities, are required to provide a site map.

## What should a Site Map look like?

The site map does not need to be complicated or overly detailed. When creating a site map, It is important to include all points of egress, layout of the room(s) in the facility, and to label locations where substances are stored in the facility. Please feel free to reference the example site map below when creating a facility's site map.




Figure 1. Example Site Plan
