



INSTRUCTIONS FOR RENEWING A TYPE 3 RECYCLED WATER GENERAL PERMIT FOR GRAY WATER

INSTRUCTIONS

This form allows a permittee to renew a Type 3 Recycled Water General Permit for Gray Water. The permittee shall submit this application for renewal at least 30 days before the permit expiration date. Type 3 Recycled Water General Permit for Gray Water must be renewed in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) R18-9-A705 or they will expire.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR PERMIT RENEWAL?

In order to be eligible for permit renewal, there must be no substantial change to the reuse activity previously permitted. If there are changes to **any of the following**, you may not renew your existing gray water permit and must re-apply for a new permit:

- A change in the source of the gray water
- A change in the volume of gray water to be used at the site
- A change in the location or the size of the gray water use area
- A change in the type of vegetation to be irrigated

IS THERE A FEE?

The renewal fee for a Type 3 Recycled Water General Permit for Gray Water is **\$1,500.00**. Make the check payable to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality and attach it to the renewal form.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY PERMIT HAS EXPIRED?

If your permit has expired you may not renew the permit and will need to submit a new Type 3 NOI and supplemental documentation with the fee that is outlined in the NOI.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

If there are no substantial changes to your existing Type 3 permit, the authorization will be signed by the Water Reuse Value Stream Manager and a copy will be sent to you for your records. The renewal will become effective on the date of signature.

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1030:

- (1) ADEQ shall not base a licensing decision, in whole or in part, on a requirement or condition not specifically authorized by statute or rule. General authority in a statute does not authorize a requirement or condition unless a rule is made pursuant to it that specifically authorizes the requirement or condition.
- (2) Prohibited licensing decisions may be challenged in a private civil action. Relief may be awarded to the prevailing party against ADEQ, including reasonable attorney fees, damages, and all fees associated with the license application.
- (3) ADEQ employees may not intentionally or knowingly violate the requirement for specific licensing authority. Violation is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal, pursuant to ADEQ's adopted personnel policy. ADEQ employees are still afforded the immunity in A.R.S. §§ 12-821.01 and 12-820.02.
