This State Water Quality Certification (WQC) is issued by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) under the authority of § 401(a) of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA) (33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.) and Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.) § 49-202; and Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) Title 18, Chapter 11, Water Quality Standards.

Based on the information provided and identified in Section 1 below, ADEQ certifies the reissuance of the 2026 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Nationwide Permits (NWPs) listed in Section 2 below, with the inclusion of the 2026 Regional Conditions for the State of Arizona, with the following exceptions:


- Surface waters listed on the Clean Water Act § 303(d) list of impaired and threatened waters and lakes.
- Surface waters listed on the Clean Water Act § 303(d) list of not-attaining and threatened waters and lakes.
- Surface waters designated as Outstanding Arizona Waters in A.A.C. R18-11-112(G).

Activities within the waters listed above require an individual § 401 Water Quality Certification from ADEQ.

1. Information Reviewed

During the development of this WQC, ADEQ received the following documents from the USACE in order to prepare this WQC; ADEQ also participated in conversations with the USACE Los Angeles (LA) District and the Phoenix Branch:

- a. Email from Spencer MacNeil, Deputy Chief, Regulator Division, Ventura Field Office received May 7, 2025, providing notification of the 2025 NWP Reissuances and the draft 2026 Nationwide Permit Regional Conditions for the State of Arizona; and requesting the 30-day pre-filing meeting to discuss the reissuance.
- b. The pre-filing notification meeting was held virtually on June 3, 2025; staff from ADEQ, USACE LA District and the Phoenix Branch.
- c. Letter and attachments from Aaron O. Allen, Chief, Regulatory Division, USACE LA District received June 18, 2025, requesting certification for the 2026 NWPs.
- d. The USACE notice of proposed rulemaking, Docket Number COE-2025-0002, Proposal to Reissue and Modify Nationwide Permits, June 18, 2025.

2. Description of Activities to be Certified

Nationwide Permits are issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to authorize categories of activities under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act, and Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899, that have no more than minimal individual and cumulative adverse environmental effects. All NWPs being reissued are shown in Table 1.
