

Clean Water Act § 401 Water Quality Certification
Roadrunner Prospectors' Club Placer Mining Claims
Prescott National Forest - Big Bug Creek and Eugenie Stream

1. Authorization

This State Water Quality Certification (WQC) is issued by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) under the authority of § 401(a) of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA) (33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.) and Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.) § 49-202. This § 401 WQC will become part of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) § 404 permit SPL-2010-00353.

Based on the information provided and identified in Section 3 of this certification, ADEQ certifies that the placer mining activities on Big Bug Creek and Eugenie Stream within the Prescott National Forest will not violate applicable Surface Water Quality Standards (SWQS).

2. Project Location

The Roadrunner Prospectors' Club has five placer mining leases on Big Bug Creek and two placer mining leases on Eugenie Stream in the Prescott National Forest, Yavapai County, in Township 12.5N, Range 01W.

3. Description of Certified Activities

The Roadrunner Prospectors' Club conducts monthly placer mining events for mining enthusiasts on Big Bug Creek and Eugenie Stream. All operations adhere to the regulations established by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Nationwide Permit No. 18 – Mining Discharges; the Bureau of Land Management; and Prescott National Forest.

Operations utilize sluice boxes, recirculators, and suction dredges with an inlet no greater than 3-inches. All water and materials are filtered outside the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM) before discharging clean water back into Big Bug Creek or Eugenie Stream.

When water flow is dry, prospectors utilize dry washers, recirculators, metal detectors, and vacuums. Members must bring their own potable water for equipment use. Material processing and gasoline engine maintenance are strictly prohibited within the OHWM. Before leaving, the Roadrunners Prospectors' Club will restore the area as closely as possible to its natural, pre-mining landscape.

4. Information Reviewed

In evaluating and issuing this CWA § 401 WQC, the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) reviewed the following records on file:

- Current Application: CWA § 401 WQC application package, including all associated plans, maps, and project details submitted by the Roadrunner Prospectors' Club (Attn: Les Glover), received on August 5, 2026.
- Historical Certifications: Background information from previously certified § 401 applications for the Roadrunner Prospectors' Club (Attn: Les Glover) dated August 2008 and December 2022.
- Water Quality & Impairment Standards:
 - Designated Uses: Pursuant to Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) Title 18, Chapter 11, Article 1, Appendix B, Big Bug Creek is designated for Aquatic and Wildlife Cold (A&We), Full Body Contact (FBC), Fish Consumption (FC), Agriculture Irrigation (AgI), and Agriculture Livestock (AgL). Designated Uses for Eugenie Stream are Aquatic and Wildlife Ephemeral (A&We), and Partial Body Contact (PBC).

- Impairments: Pursuant to Appendix C of the 2024 CWA Assessment, Big Bug Creek is classified as impaired for Cadmium and Zinc; Eugenie Stream is classified as impaired for *Escherichia coli* (*E. coli*).
