

PUBLIC NOTICE

YOU HAVE A VOICE IN AIR POLLUTION CONTROL IN ARIZONA

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) proposes to issue Permit Reopening Number 95095, which reopens Air Quality Control Renewal Permit Number 89460 to address directions to ADEQ in Order Number OAR-22-000-4700 from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The permit is being issued to Salt River Project (SRP) for Coronado Generating Station (CGS), a coal-fired power plant located six (6) miles northeast of St. Johns, AZ off U.S. Hwy 191 in Apache County. The mailing address for the facility is P.O. Box 1018, St. Johns, AZ 85936-1018. The facility is subject to the requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act, Code of Federal Regulations, Arizona Revised Statute 49-426, and the Arizona Administrative Code, Title 18, Chapter 2. The facility emits the following air contaminants: coarse particulate matter with diameters 10 micrometers or less (PM₁₀), fine particulate matter with diameters 2.5 micrometers or less (PM_{2.5}), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), nitrogen oxides (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), carbon monoxide (CO), hazardous air pollutants (HAPs), and greenhouse gases (GHGs).

This public notice provides information to help you participate in the decision-making process. You have an opportunity to submit written comments about this permit. To submit written comments, include your name, mailing address, signature (and/or your agent or attorney signature) and clearly explain why the permit should or should not be issued. In addition, ADEQ will hold a virtual public hearing via the GoToWebinar application on September 6, 2022 at 6:00 p.m., during which you may make oral comments. If you wish to verbally comment during the hearing, you can connect using the GoToWebinar application using a computer, tablet or phone that is equipped to meet the internet and system requirements. If you do not wish to verbally comment, you are invited to listen to the webinar by calling 631-992-3221 and entering Access Code 562-677-251.

You may comment on only those permit conditions that are being amended in this permitting action and the associated technical support document. Grounds for comment are limited to the criteria for issuance spelled out in the state air pollution control laws or rules. The public notice period is in effect from August 4, 2022 to September 6, 2022. Comments may be submitted in writing to: [David Kim](#), Air Permits Unit, ADEQ, 1110 W. The draft permit and related documentation are available for review online at azdeq.gov/notices by searching for the date of this public notice, or in person at the ADEQ Records Center by scheduling an appointment at least 48 hours in advance. ADEQ will consider all comments received in making a final decision on the proposed permit. Everyone commenting will receive notification of the final decision. People who file comments on the permit will have the right to appeal the final decision as an appealable agency action to the Office of Administrative Hearing (OAH) pursuant to §41.1092.03, and the appeal must be filed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of the final decision. The OAH may sustain, modify, or reverse the final decision.

This permit is subject to review by the EPA pursuant to 40 CFR 70.8 and Arizona Administrative Code R18-2-307. If EPA does not object to the issuance of this permit, you may petition to EPA within sixty (60) days after the

expiration of EPA's forty-five (45)-day review period. A petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. Any person who petitions to EPA pursuant to 40 CFR 70.8(d) shall notify ADEQ by certified mail as soon as possible, but in no case more than 10 days following such petition. The notification shall include the grounds for objection and whether such objections were raised during the public comment period.

ADEQ will take reasonable measures to provide access to department services to individuals with limited ability to speak, write or understand English and/or to those with disabilities.
