## PROPOSED ARIZONA POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (AZPDES) PERMIT MODIFICATION

Pursuant to the Clean Water Act and in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) R18-9-A907, the Director of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) proposes to issue an Arizona Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (AZPDES) Permit to discharge pollutants to Waters of the United States to the following applicant, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions:

Salt River Project applied for a renewal AZPDES permit for the proposed discharge of up to 5.2 million gallons per day (mgd) of treated industrial wastewater from the Santan Generating Station to outfall 021 to the Western Canal – a Phoenix Area Canal in the Middle Gila River Basin in Township 1 S, Range 6 E, Section 21, in Maricopa County, Arizona. The Santan Generating Station is a major industrial facility.

Persons may submit comments on the proposed action in writing, to Julia Rowe, Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Water Quality Division, 1110 W. All written comments received by ADEQ by the close of business on the date 30 days after publication of this notice will be considered in the final permit decision.

A public hearing will be held on December 23, 2024 starting at 6:00 PM MST. The purpose of the public hearing is to allow the public to make comments for the record. ADEQ will respond in writing to all comments submitted during the formal public comment period. The public hearing will be held remotely due to the current health concerns posed by Covid-19. There will be no physical access to the hearing.

If you wish to verbally comment during the hearing, you can connect using the GoToWebinar application using a computer, tablet or phone that is equipped to meet the internet and system requirements.
