

**PROPOSED ARIZONA POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (AZPDES)  
PERMIT MODIFICATION**

Pursuant to the Clean Water Act and in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) R18-9-A907, the Director of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) proposes to modify an Arizona Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (AZPDES) Permit to discharge pollutants to Waters of the United States to the following applicant, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions:

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SRP is a water and power utility operating in the State of Arizona and operates a water distribution system that provides surface and groundwater to a 248,200-acre area within metropolitan Phoenix for agricultural, urban, and domestic water source uses. Surface and groundwater supplies are delivered to users through a canal and lateral system over 135 miles in length within metropolitan Phoenix in Maricopa County. SRP applied for a renewal AZPDES permit for the proposed discharge of groundwater from a total of 192 wells contributing groundwater to the Phoenix Canals in the Middle Gila River Basin. SRP also provides supplemental groundwater to 11 Urban Lakes within the Phoenix Metropolitan Area. The permit is being modified to correct typographical errors in the permit. ADEQ is seeking public comment because these errors impact the applicable permit limitations.

Persons may submit comments or request a public hearing on the proposed action in writing, to Julia Rowe, Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Water Quality Division, 1110 W. Washington St., Phoenix, Arizona 85007, or electronically to [rowe.julia@azdeq.gov](mailto:rowe.julia@azdeq.gov). All written comments received by ADEQ by the close of business on the date 30 days after publication of this notice will be considered in the final permit decision. A public hearing request must be in writing and must include the reasons for such request. If there is a significant degree of public interest, the Director will hold a hearing in accordance with A.A.C. R18-9-A908(B).

ADEQ will take reasonable measures to provide access to department services to individuals with limited ability to speak, write or understand English and/or to those with disabilities.
