PUBLIC NOTICE - The Air Force Civil Engineer Center (AFCEC) announces that a five-year review will be conducted for Luke Air Force Base (AFB). Response actions on Installation Restoration Program (IRP) Sites RW002 (Low-Level Radioactive Burial Site), LF003 (Outboard Runway Landfill), FT007E (North Fire Training Area – East), DP023 (Old Surface Impoundment), DP013 (Drainage Ditch Disposal Area), LF014 (Old Salvage Yard Burial Site), ST018 (Liquid Waste Storage Facility), SD020 (Oil/Water Separator Canal and Earth Fissure), LF025 (Northwest Landfill), SD038 (OWS at Auto Hobby Shop), SS042 (Bulk Fuels Storage Area), and TU044 (Waterdog Annex) at Luke AFB have been conducted in accordance with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), which requires that a five-year review be conducted. The review will be conducted in accordance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency Five-Year Review Guidance. The Air Force is the lead agency for this five-year review.

The review will be conducted to ensure that the response action and final recommendations for these Sites at Luke AFB remain protective of human health and the environment. This review will commence in September 2021 and is scheduled for completion in October 2022.
