Sahuarita Air Force Range Restoration Advisory Board

The Sahuarita Air Force Range Formerly Used Defense Site (FUDS) is located east of Sahuarita in Pima County, Arizona. The site used from 1942 through 1958 for military training by Davis-Monthan and other Army Airfields or Air Force Bases. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is investigating the site under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program for hazards, such as military munitions, that may remain from previous military activities.

The Department of Defense encourages community involvement in the environmental restoration process. A Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) is one of many methods the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers may use to facilitate public participation at FUDS. RABs provide a collaborative forum for landowners, community members, government agencies and other interested parties to discuss and identify the most efficient and productive means to restore the environment.
