



APPLYING FOR A NEW EPA ID | USER GUIDE

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Introduction

Under the Resource and Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA), obtaining an EPA ID is required in order to notify the EPA of hazardous waste activities. This user guide is designed to help the regulated community apply for a new EPA ID.

Navigating myDEQ

- **Browser Compatibility** myDEQ performs best in Google Chrome (PC & Mac), Firefox (PC & Mac) and Safari (Mac only). Internet Explorer is not recommended due to compatibility issues.
- myDEQ Tooltips Not sure what something means? Hover over the ⑦ icon to learn more about terminology on that screen.
- Need Help? The NEED HELP? button (upper-right) is an easy way to access myDEQ Support contacts.
- **Timeout Warning** After more than 20 minutes of non-activity on a screen, myDEQ will timeout and exit the application. If no information was saved, you will have to start over.
- User Roles A Responsible Corporate Officer (RCO) or Delegated Responsible Officer (DRO) is needed to certify the application, but a Submitter or Data Entry user can prepare the document | More at azdeq.gov/roles >

WHAT IS myDEQ?

myDEQ is the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality's (ADEQ) online web portal, designed to assist customers in meeting their environmental priorities and responsibilities.

How Do I Get a myDEQ Account?

Getting an account is easy:

Step 1: Request an account (completed by the Responsible Corporate Officer - RCO) | More at azdeq.gov/roles >

Step 2: Verify your identity online (also available by mail)

Step 3: Choose a password and security questions

Getting Started

Step 1: Once you have logged in at **my.azdeq.gov**, start the application from the **myAPPLICATIONS**, tab by selecting **GET NEW**.

Step 2: From the list of possible ADEQ permits, registrations and certificates, select **EPA ID (RCRA)** under the Waste Programs section. Then select either permanent or short term and click **CONTINUE**:

- Select **Permanent EPA ID Number** if you plan to have ongoing regulated activities at your facility (e.g., generating hazardous waste as part of normal business operations).
- Select **Short Term Generator** if you generated hazardous waste as a result of a temporary, one-time event with a 90-day duration limit.

Step 3: Select or add a company that the EPA ID number applies to and click START APPLICATION.



NOTE: If you select **Add a Company/Agency**, a pop-up alert will instruct the RCO to add a company using the mySETTINGS tab. This will have to be completed and approved by myDEQ staff in order to start your EPA ID application. Once the company is approved, it will be listed as an option to select. Waste Activities

If you are applying as a **short term generator**, skip to **Page 6**. **Permanent EPA ID Number** applicants select the regulated waste activities performed at the facility. The most common selection is "Generator of hazardous waste" | **Learn more at azdeq.gov/WasteActivites >**

NOTE: You do NOT need to select "United States importer of hazardous waste" or "Mixed waste (hazardous/ radioactive or hazardous/infectious) generator" if they do not apply to the facility.

Completing the Application

When starting the application process, make sure you have required information available. If at any time you need to exit the application, be sure to click **SAVE & EXIT** (top right), and click **SAVE & CONTINUE** to save your progress on each page and continue with the application.

Step 1: Select or add the place where regulated waste activities will be conducted. If you have any existing permits/registrations with myDEQ, those places will appear in a list. If you need to add a new place, follow the prompts to provide all required information.

Step 2: Select the land type for your facility. The private land type is most commonly selected. If the land type is both municipal and another option, select the option that is not municipal.

Step 4: Enter the property owner information. The legal property owner is a common issue with EPA ID applications. If you do not know the legal property owner information, you can refer to your county's assessor office for assistance | **View property owner search resources at azdeq.gov/CountyAssessors** >

Step 5: Enter the operator start date and type. The operator start date should reflect when the listed organization first started operating at the listed address. The calendar button can be used to help select the date. The operator type corresponds to your **facility's type** and is most commonly private. If the operator type is both municipal and another option, select the option that is not municipal.

Step 6: Review the generator category information and select your facility's generator category. To help determine your facility's generator category, refer to the EPA's Categories of Hazardous Waste Generators webpage | **Visit epa.gov/hwgenerators/categories-hazardous-waste-generators >**



NOTE: Short Term Generator applications will NOT have a Very Small Quantity Generator option.

Step 7: If you are applying as a **short term generator**, skip to **Step 8**. **Permanent EPA ID Number** applicants, indicate whether you are operatoring under 40 CFR 266 Subpart P, and if the location is an academic laboratory.



Subpart P affects healthcare facilities and reverse distributors. For guidance on if you are operating under Subpart P, see 40 CFR 266.500 for definitions and 40 CFR 266.501 for applicability | Learn more at ecfr.gov >

The alternative requirements for academic laboratories are listed in 40 CFR 262.10(l). The academic laboratories being referred to are defined as "Eligible academic entity" and "Laboratory" in 40 CFR 262.200 | Learn more at ecfr.gov >

Step 8: Select codes for the hazardous waste generated at your facility by adding from the **Most commonly used codes** list or by using the search bar. If applicable, review your hazardous waste manifests to see what has been shipped by your facility. - Generators that import or export waste destined for recovery or disposal may be a recognized trader | 40 CFR 260.10 >
- Generators that import or export spent lead-acid batteries may be exempt from some hazardous waste management requirements

Completing the Application (cont.)

Step 9 (cont.): If you are applying as a **short term generator**, skip to **Step 11**. **Permanent EPA ID Number** applicants, indicate the waste activities that apply to your site.



Universal waste includes certain batteries, pesticides, mercury-containing equipment, lamps and aerosol cans | 40 CFR Part 273 >

- Large quantity handlers accumulate 5,000 kilograms or more of universal waste at any one time during the calendar year |
 40 CFR 273.9 >
- A destination facility is one that treats, disposes of, or recycles a particular category of universal waste | 40 CFR 260.10 >



Used oil is any oil that has been refined from crude oil, or any synthetic oil, that has been used and, as a result of such use, is contaminated by physical or chemical impurities | 40 CFR 279.1 >

- Transporters are those who transport used oil: those who collect used oil from more than one generator and transport the collected oil; and owners and operators of used oil transfer facilities.
- Processors and/or re-refiners are generators who process used oil.
- Off-specification used oil burners are facilities where used oil, not meeting specific requirements, is burned for energy recovery in certain devices.
- Fuel marketers are facilities that either direct shipments of off-specification used oil to a used oil burner or first claim that used oil is to be burned for energy recovery.

Step 10: If you are applying as a short term generator, skip to Step 11. Permanent EPA ID Number

applicants, indicate if you will be managing any hazardous secondary materials (HSMs) and information about the HSMs, if applicable. An HSM is a secondary material (e.g., spent material, by-product, or sludge) that, when discarded, would be identified as hazardous waste | **View 40 CFR 260.10** >

Step 11: If you are applying for a permanent EPA ID Number, skip to Step 12. Short term generator

applicants, indicate if you are a mixed waste generator. You are a mixed waste generator if the facility generates waste that contains **both** hazardous waste and source, special nuclear or byproduct material subject to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Step 12: Enter any comments, including additional information that may help to clarify options selected on your EPA ID application. **Short term generators** should add comments explaining the one-time event.



Step 13: Complete the application by reviewing the summary page (using **EDIT** to modify a section as needed), certifying the submission (only RCOs or DROs can certify), and submitting payment (fee due for **short term generator** applications only).

NOTE: If making edits from the summary page, click through each section of the application to return to the summary page and proceed to certify.
