For changes to existing fees: cpi indicates an increase based on a CPI adjustment; and cpi+ indicates an increase beyond a CPI adjustment.

Rule Updates



In addition to non-substantive and technical changes, substantive changes to the 6/27/2024 draft rule on the ADEQ website include:

- R18-13-702, Plan Review Fees:
 - Initial plan review fees remain unchanged and will not be subject to an annual CPI adjustment;
 - "Solid Waste Landfills Type IV RD&D" category of fee for plan modification now deleted; and
- R18-13-1410(D): establishes separate annual registration fee for BMW transfer facilities of \$3,000.

Rule Text Update: BMW – Facilities



New Fees

R18-13-1410. Storage, Transfer, Treatment, and Disposal Facilities; Facility Plan Approval; Fees

- **A.** A person shall obtain solid waste facility plan approval from the Department as prescribed in A.R.S. § 49-762.04 and pursuant to R18-13-702 to construct any facility that will be used to store, transfer, treat, or dispose of biohazardous medical waste that was generated off site. Plan approval shall be obtained before starting construction of the medical waste treatment or disposal facility. This requirement also applies to solid waste facilities for which an operator self-certifies under A.R.S. § 49-762.05, if the facility also will receive biohazardous medical waste.
- <u>D.</u> Annual registration fee. The Department shall bill an annual registration fee to a biohazardous medical waste facility described in subsection (A) as follows:
 - 1. For a disposal or treatment facility, \$12,500;
 - 2. For a storage facility, \$7,500; and
 - 3. For a transfer facility, \$3,000.
- **E.** A facility subject to more than one fee under subsection (D) shall only pay the highest fee amount.
- F. The biohazardous medical waste facility shall pay the annual registration fee within 30 days of invoice receipt.

ARTICLE 16. BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR PETROLEUM CONTAMINATED SOIL

R18-13-1606. Fees

CPI

A. In accordance with A.R.S. §§ 49-855(C)(2) and 49-863, the treatment, storage, or disposal facility in this state that first receives a shipment of PCS shall remit to the Department a fee of \$4.50 \$6.68 per ton but not more than \$45,000 \$66,835.67 per generator site per year for PCS that is transported to the facility.

R18-13-1606. Fees [cont'd]

- B. Initial registration fee. Upon making a request for a special waste identification number on a form as provided by the Director pursuant to Article 13, A generator of PCS shall submit to the Department an initial registration fee of \$900.
- C. Annual registration fee. The Department shall bill an annual registration fee to a generator of PCS or special waste receiving facility that has received facility approval under R18-13-1607 that has not filed a notice of termination of registration with the Department as follows:
 - 1. For a generator of PCS, \$750; and
 - 2. For a special waste receiving facility, \$5,000.
- <u>D.</u> The generator of PCS or special waste receiving facility shall pay the annual registration fee within 30 days of invoice receipt.
- E. In accordance with A.R.S. § 49-855(G), a solid waste landfill that pays registration fees under A.R.S. § 49-747 is exempt from the annual registration fee under subsection (B) of this Section.

Rule Text: Universal CPI Adjustment



All fees will be subject to a CPI adjustment based upon this methodology.

Beginning January 1, 2026, the Director shall adjust the fee amounts in the relevant section annually by the following method:

- 1. Multiply the amount by the October CPI for the most recent year and then divide by the October CPI for the year 2024. The October CPI for any year is the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, Phoenix-Mesa-Scottsdale, AZ, all items published by the United States Department of Labor at www.bls.gov/cpi/regional-resources.htm, for October of that year.
- 2. Round the result from paragraph (1) to the nearest cent. ADEQ shall post the new amounts on its webpage as soon as practicable.

Subject: Waste Programs Fee Rule - Consumer Price Index Adjustments

Pursuant to Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.) R18-8-260(M)(4), the amounts in subsections R18-8-260(M)(1), (2) and (3), and R18-8-270(G)(6) shall be updated annually before each April 1. This memorandum has been created in order to document the methodology for adjusting the applicable Waste Programs Division's fees.

A.A.C. R18-8-260(M)(4)(a):

"a. On or about January 15 after the calendar year to be updated, ADEQ shall use the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics CPI Inflation Calculator at bls.gov/data/inflation_calculator.htm, as follows unless updated:

i.Insert the current maximum fee, per ton rate, or hourly rate in the first box.

ii.Insert December of the calendar year 13 months previous in the before-inflation box. Insert the previous December in the after-inflation box.

iii. Select "Calculate". The new maximum, per ton rate, or hourly rate for the billing period beginning January 1 will be shown."

Landfill Post-Closure Care Fee



R18-13-2103(B) extends the existing annual fee for landfills during closure to apply during the full post-closure care period.

What is post-closure care?

Following the completion of closure, the landfill is still subject to monitoring requirements for a period of at least 30 years. This period of continued monitoring is known as post-closure care. During this time, the landfill must be monitored for groundwater and methane generation, as well as maintenance conducted on the landfill cap, storm water control system, and leachate system.

Why is there an annual fee for landfills in post-closure care?

ADEQ still has responsibility for regulatory oversight of landfills in post-closure care. This oversight includes inspections and records management. The annual fee is necessary for ADEQ costs to conduct this oversight. The post-closure care period and annual fee ends when the landfill is released from post-closure care obligations by the Director.

Landfills - Post-Closure Care Fee cont'd



Updated Fees CPI+

R18-13-2103. Annual Landfill Registration: Due Date and Fees Landfill Closure and Post-Closure Care Obligations; Fees

C. B. From the time a solid waste landfill stops accepting waste as specified in subsection (B) (A), until the owner or operator of the solid waste landfill is released from its obligation to provide financial assurance for closure has completed closure and is released from its obligation for post-closure care as required by A.R.S. §§ 49-761 or 49-770, the annual registration fee is \$1,250 \$3,500.

Rule Explanation: New Tire Sellers Fee



Incorporated CPI Fees

New Title 22 of this rule, titled "New Tire Sellers", incorporates the existing fee on the sale of new tires first established in 1991 currently codified at A.R.S. § 44-1302. This rule incorporates the fee as is, subject to a CPI adjustment and continuing annual CPI adjustment in the future.

• Fee: 2% of purchase price of each new tire sold, capped at \$4.66 per tire (cap subject to annual adjustment).

Rule Explanation: New Tire Sellers Fee cont'd




Incorporated CPI Fees

Fee continues to be deposited into the Waste Tire Fund under A.R.S. § 44-1305. Distribution and prescribed uses of moneys from Waste Tire Fund unchanged:

- 3.5% of moneys from Waste Tire Fund deposited into Solid Waste Fee Fund for ADEQ monitoring and enforcing of waste tire disposal statutes (Title 44, Ch. 9, Art. 8). See A.R.S. § 44-1305(B)(1).
- Lesser of 5% or \$250,000 may be used by ADEQ for tire fire cleanup expenses if no other funds are available. See A.R.S. § 44-1305(B)(2).
- Remainder of moneys in Waste Tire Fund distributed among counties in proportion to the number of vehicles registered in the county. See A.R.S. § 44-1305(B)(3).
 - County to use funds for implementing a Waste Tire Program. See A.R.S. § 44-1305(C).

Methodology for Proposed Fees






- Department Functions +
 Regulated Activity = ADEQ

What goes into ADEQ cost?




- Administrative: Leadership, IT, payroll, billing, human resources, legal, rules/ policy development, fleet services, employee related expenses
- Pre-Inspection: Historical data review, registrations, waste generation, review of applicable permits
- Office Time: Notification, distribution of resources
- Inspection: Staff time, medical monitoring, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), documentation of the inspection
- Post-Inspection: Enforcement if necessary, case closure, filing, public records retention


