

Notice of Site Listing Activities and 30-Day Comment Period

Bahama Avenue and Bimini Lane

Water Quality Assurance Revolving Fund Site

On September 16, 2021 the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) placed the Bahama Avenue and Bimini Lane site (Site) on the Water Quality Assurance Revolving Fund Registry¹.

The Site contains contaminated soil and groundwater in Lake Havasu City, Mohave County, AZ. The Site contaminants of concern are tetrachloroethene, trichloroethene, thallium and arsenic. Approximate Site boundaries are Industrial Boulevard to the north, Palo Verde Boulevard to the south, the Orion Lane alignment to the east, and London Bridge Road to the west. The boundaries estimate the geographic extent of known contamination and may change as new information becomes available.

The Site Eligibility & Evaluation score is 46 out of 120. The score is based on available information regarding the presence of hazardous substances at the Site. The scoring of a site, its relative score, or placement on the registry does not necessarily represent a determination that the release of a hazardous substance from the site poses a threat to human health, welfare, or the environment.

Other Site Listing activities include²:

1. ADEQ developed the Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS) scope of work. Any person, by agreement with the department, may develop and implement the RI/FS work plan³; to do so, contact Hazel Cox at Cox.Hazel@azdeq.gov.
2. ADEQ created a fact sheet and Community Involvement Plan (CIP) outline.
3. ADEQ may hold a public meeting if significant interest exists; contact Hazel Cox for requests.
