Water Quality Assurance Revolving Fund (WQARF)



❑ What is a WQARF Community Advisory Board (CAB)?

- A CAB is a group of concerned citizens selected to **review**, **discuss** and **provide input** on proposed remedies to clean up sites with soil and/or groundwater contamination.
- The main responsibility of a CAB is to advise ADEQ, the public and other interested parties about the issues and concerns of the community related to the cleanup of a WQARF site.

- ❑ CABs must have a minimum of five (5) members, per A.R.S. §49-289.03(E).
- ❑ CABs generally meet at least once per year, or more often if requested or necessary.
