The following matters were discussed, considered, and decided upon at the meeting:

1. Call to Order/Introductions

Mr. Stoltzfus opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. with greetings and introductions.

2. Acceptance and/or Changes to October 14, 2008 minutes

After introductions, Mr. Stoltzfus stated that a quorum was not met at this meeting, and therefore, business decisions could not be made.

3. Update on WCP WQARF sites

A video of the soil vapor extraction system at the North Plume F & B Site of the WCP WQARF sites was presented. This was followed by a PowerPoint presentation updating activities at the WCP WQARF sites.

4. Distribution of Final Remedial Investigation (RI) Report for North Plume

After the update on WCP WQARF sites, Mr. Chiaradia gave the CAB members a copy of the Final Remedial Investigation (RI) Report for the North Plume of the WCP WQARF sites which contained an Executive Summary, Table of Contents, the Definitions for Acronyms in the report and a CD containing the report contents, tables, figures and supporting laboratory data.

5. Distribution of Community Involvement Plan (CIP)

Ms. Olivarez explained that the WCP CIP is currently being reviewed by the Waste Programs Director, Amanda Stone, and that the CIP should be complete and ready for distribution at the next CAB meeting.

6. Call to the Public

The public was called on. Mr. Stoltzfus asked if copies of any site information could be requested and obtained. Mr. Chiaradia replied yes, anyone can request copies of site information through ADEQ.

Mr. Hipsher asked if ADEQ was going to use the new data on the contamination plume to the north of the Grand Canal Plume Project Site. Mr. Chiaradia replied that ADEQ is working on this issue. The eastern PCE plume is currently being evaluated by the preliminary assessment/investigative unit. Any actions would be within the new economic budget constraints of the agency.

Mr. Stoltzfus asked what was found along Indian School Road and what was found between the two wells located on north 33rd Avenue south of Indian School Road? Mr. Chiaradia replied that the two wells historically have not shown to have PCE contamination and that the little contamination that was found from the Soil Vapor Study along Indian School Road north of Grand Avenue was not enough to indicate a source area that produced 200 parts per billion (ppb) found in the wells at the North Canal Plume Project Site.

Mr. Holzer asked if ADEQ has the history of ownership for the Osborn Semiconductor Plant Site. Mr. Chiaradia replied yes, all the parties have been identified and settlements have been reached with each of them. Mr. Chiaradia and Ms. Olivarez explained to the CAB members and the public that budget constraints necessitate changes in work plans at ADEQ. More of the project tasks will be done in-house. Mass mailings have currently been halted and communications will be carried out via email, phone and the ADEQ Web site.

7. Future meeting plans/Agenda discussion

The next meeting will be in approximately three months, if needed.

8. Adjournment


Mr. Stoltzfus adjourned the meeting.

- Volatile organic compounds (VOCs) were first detected in groundwater in the WCP area in July 1982
- The City of Phoenix (COP) detected trichloroethylene (TCE) in four municipal public supply wells, COP #70, #71, #151, and #152
- In 1986 COP Wells #70 and #71 are shut down
- In 1989, COP elected to take Wells #151 and #152 off-line




- ADEQ designated the area of groundwater contamination as the West Central Phoenix WQARF site
- The area was placed in the WQARF Priority List in 1987

 In 1998, the five WCP Sites were separated out and entered into the WQARF Registry



West Central Phoenix (WCP) WQARF Sites






0.5 Miles Phoenix, Arizona November, 2006 WASTE PROGRAMS DIVISION




Site Update East Grand Avenue




The East Grand Avenue SVE System

1,095 lbs to date















PASSIVE SOIL-GAS SAMPLE LOCATION






