The Groundwater Section of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) has received your Notification of Intent (NOI) to discharge under a Type 2.02 General Aquifer Protection Permit for Intermediate Stockpiles at Mining Sites.

ADEQ received the Renewal NOI on July 30, 2018, for the discharging facility described as the **Development Rock Stockpile** located at 35° 52' 59.39" North and 112° 05' 46.23" West. ADEQ's findings are as follows:

- The permittee **IS AUTHORIZED** to operate the Development Rock Stockpile at the location specified according to the information supplied in the original NOI and renewal form under the terms of the general permit recorded as **P-100333**. The permittee must comply with all design, installation, operation, monitoring, record keeping, reporting and closure requirements specified in (A.A.C.) R18-9-C302 and R18-9-A301(B). The permittee must comply with all design, installation, operation, monitoring, record keeping, reporting and closure requirements specified in A.A.C. R18-9-C301, and also with all other applicable requirements of 49 A.R.S. 2, and 18 A.A.C. 9, Article 3. The original Notice of Recording was issued on month day, year, and shall renew on August 30, 2018. The authorization to operate under the Type 2 General Permit expires **SEVEN (7) YEARS** from the date ADEQ considered your renewal NOI to be complete, or **August 30, 2025**. The permittee may renew this general permit authorization by submitting a new renewal form at least 30 days before the expiration date.

This authorization can be revoked and an individual permit required in the event the permittee fails to comply with the terms of the general permit described in the rules, or if the discharge activity causes or contributes to or has the potential to cause or contribute to the violation of an Aquifer Water Quality Standard at the applicable point of compliance.
