Tier Framework (90 mins)	 Review TWG member input on the tiered framework Potential decision on next steps for development of the framework 		 Karthik presented Hybrid Framework and Mural board. Jake advocate of adding reuse to the treatment levels. Ray stated need to keep in mind NSF 40 disinfection can be used for multiple types of reuse. Collin Bishop: NSF350 and Nitrogen clarification requested. Joelle believes two permits one for reuse is too bifurcated. Consider reuse as its own chart. Jake stated parthenogens needs to be addressed in these charts, especially with reuse in the future. Jenny Vitale stated need to limit condition(s) chart that proceeds this chart to ensure limiting conditions will force into the correct tiers. Also, dead set against renewable operating permit, government involvement. Will do all in power to stop these rules if renewable permits are a part of the rulemaking. Monitoring and maintenance intervals are too frequent. Fecal and E. coli are hard to understand for engineers, needs to have something that translate this into common understanding. Conventional Tier- reluctant to put number there but a range would be better. Need to add high strength waste to this. Recommends limiting condition table/ assign risk to a site. Need to discuss limiting conditions more. Jenny feels like meetings are being had and different things are being said in different meetings and ADEQ is not being transparent. Matt commented that ADEQ is very transparent. Jake reiterated importance of viability and this structure does give options to designers. Wants to see PPL location in this structure as well. Heid: Certification and training and guidance would help bring pathogens standards and accompanying technologies and handles these issues. Consider a life of system defined and must make a change in lieu of a renewal permit. Ray stated we should discuss frequency of pumping out septic systems. Should be measured and only pump when needed. Research exists to support this idea instead of pumping just check. Also, reuse and considering health imp

Like cars inspection has nothing to do with repairs. Credential/ licensing oversight of professionals may by a good solution as opposed to hammer over homeowner. Delaware and MN good examples. Supports Ray comment to only pump when needed; measure. Commercial with high waste, where do they fall into the tiers? Karthik said in non-residential. Consider how other states handle commercial systems. Monitoring project- we need to make sure doing some commercial facilities. Need allow rural to have commercial businesses especially small businesses. Joelle has been very receptive to comments. This framework is EPA recommendations and NSF considering going this keeps us relevant and risk will be built in reuse in the future. Jake non-residential there is info available the broadly categorizes non-res into groups. Consider as part of this new program. Jenny asked how we will integrate 1.09 into this program? 2001-05 systems? Important to honor valid permits. Jake envisions a good job of developing first 3 tiers then we can look into 1.09 deeper. Ray likes idea of a treatment permit and a disposal permit. Jenny stated old systems may not comply with new regs and may want to install second system as approved. Heidi 1.08 need to be defined from cesspool and clarified in rule. Jake wants team to consider/ look into low interest loans or some funding to help people move into newer systems.
