10:50 am Composting Toilets (15 mins)	Theresa Gunn, Project Manager	Group discussion on the pros and cons of regulating composting toilets		For discussion	 The group discussed whether or not the state should continue to regulate composting toiles. OWAC Member Comments: Not one size fits all. There are a wide variety of toiles. Some are dry and dump without composting NSF has established standards County has to advise they have full sewer services The concentration of the waste is so high and more difficult to treat Strength of effluent is higher from the tiny homes Fair trade some have tested and others haven't Consider registering toilets as an option (like tanks) Self-contained machines are coming EcoJon went to NSF because they are in the gray area Partnership between onsite and building departments in the counties should include all composting and incinerating toilets. Keep them in our regulatory authority Recirculating shower heads are coming soon but could have a public health risk
